**CASUALTIES COMMEMORATED WITHIN THE  
SEINE-MARITIME REGION, FRANCE**

**AMFREVILLE-LA-MI-VOIE COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

**Visiting information:**

The communal cemetery is about 1,000 yards south of the Mairie and the church, on a steep slope east of the main road. It is reached through the Route de Mesnil Esnard and the Rue Robert Turquier. In the eastern corner of the cemetery, some 30 yards from the War Memorial is the grave of a British soldier.

**Location notes:**

Amfreville-la-mi-Voie is a small town on the right bank of the River Seine. It is 3 miles (5 Kilometres) south-east of Rouen, on the Rouen-Vernon-Paris road (N.13B).

**ANCRETIEVILLE-ST. VICTOR CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

**Visiting information:**

The British grave is near the northern boundary of the churchyard.

**Location notes:**

Ancretieville-St. Victor is a village 26 Kms north-north-west of Rouen, and 6 Kms south-west of Totes, a small town at the junction of the Rouen-Dieppe (N.27) and Le Havre-Amiens (N.29) roads.

**ANGIENS CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

**Location notes:**

Angiens is a village and commune 25 kilometres south-west of Dieppe, on the road (D.37) from Veules-les-Roses to Doudeville.

**Historical notes:**

There are now nearly 20, 1939-45 war casualties commemorated in this site. Of these, a small number are unidentified.

## **ANNEVILLE-SUR-SCIE CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Visiting information:**

Anneville-sur-Scie is a village and commune 7.50 miles (12 kilometres) south of Dieppe, and 1 mile (2 kilometres) east of the Dieppe-Rouen road (N.27).

### **Historical notes:**

The British grave in this churchyard is on the north side of the church.

## **ARGUEIL COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

Argueil is a village and commune 33 kilometres east-north-east of Rouen, and 10 kilometres north of La Feuillie, a village on the Rouen to Gournay-en-Bray road (N.30).

### **Historical notes:**

The cemetery is south-east of the village, on the south side of the N.321 road to Rollevail, and is about 400 yards from Argueil Church. East of the crucifix in the central path is the grave of a British soldier.

## **ARQUES-LA-BATAILLE COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

Arques-la-Bataille is a small town 6 kilometres south-east of Dieppe on the Dieppe-Neufchatel-en-Bray Road. The Cemetery is on the right of a small road, running from the Mairie Square to join the Dieppe to Martigny road, on the south east side of town.

### **Historical notes:**

Near the south-east corner of the cemetery is the British plot, in which are the graves of 8 men of the Seaforth Highlanders.

### **AUPPEGARD CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

#### **Visiting information:**

Auppegard is a village and commune some 8 miles (13 kilometres) south-west of Dieppe, and 3 miles (5 kilometres) north of Bacqueville, on the Bacqueville-Ouville road (D.127).

#### **Historical notes:**

In the churchyard, near the north wall of the church, are the 3 British graves.

### **BAILLEUL NEUVILLE CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

#### **Location notes:**

Bailleul Neuville is a village 27 kilometres south-east of Dieppe, and 8 kilometres north of Neufchatel-en-Bray, which is 36 kilometres south-east of Dieppe.

#### **Historical notes:**

Bailleul Neuville is a village and commune 17 miles (27 kilometres) south-east of Dieppe, and 5 miles (8 kilometres) north of Neufchatel-en-Bray, which is 23 miles (36 kilometres) south-east of Dieppe. The nearest railway station is Neufchatel-en-Bray, on the Dieppe-Paris line, where taxis are available. Also, there is a bus service on the Neufchatel-Londinieres-Dieppe road (N.3 14). The British grave is some 6 yards south of the church tower.

### **BAILLY-EN-RIVIERE COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

#### **Location notes:**

Bailly-en-Riviere is a village and commune some 18 kilometres east of Dieppe on the Envermeu-Fresnay-Blangy road (D.149). The Communal Cemetery is on the north-east side of the village, some 300 yards from the church up a small road which turns right off the road

from Bailly-en-Riviere to Avesnes-en-Val (D.58). In the south-east portion of the cemetery, near the south wall, are the graves of 2 British soldiers killed in 1940.

### **BAZINVAL COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

#### **Location notes:**

Bazinval is a village and commune 34 kilometres east of Dieppe and 5 kilometres south of Gamaches, on the left side of the Gamaches-Grandcourt road. The Cemetery is south of Bazinval Church, on the left side of a road leading from the church to the village school. In the southern corner of the cemetery are three British graves.

### **BLANGY-SUR-BRESLE COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

#### **Location notes:**

Blangy-sur-Bresle is a village and commune 40 kilometres east of Dieppe, at the junction of the Rouen-Abbeville road and the Le Treport-Gumale-Paris road. The Cemetery is on the west side of the village on the south side of the road (Blangy-Envermeu-Dieppe) at its junction with the Blangy-Eu road.

#### **Historical notes:**

There are now a small number of 1914-18 and nearly 10, 1939-45 war casualties commemorated in this site.

### **BLOSSEVILLE-SUR-MER CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

#### **Location notes:**

Blosseville-sur-Mer is a village and commune some 15 miles (24 kilometres) west of Dieppe, 5 miles (8 kilometres) east of St. Valery-en-Caux, and .75 mile (1.50 kilometres) south of Veules-les-Roses. Bus services run from Veules-les-Roses to St. Valery and Dieppe. Between the church tower and the northern boundary wall of the churchyard lie the graves of 8 soldiers of the British army, 4 of whom are not identified.

### **BOIS L'EVEQUE CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

#### **Location notes:**

Bois L'Eveque is a village situated 13 kilometres east of Rouen.

## **BOLBEC COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Historical notes:**

There are 10, 1939-45 war casualties commemorated in this site. A stone memorial to six airmen, who formed one air crew, was erected by the local authorities in the centre of their collective grave.

## **BOSC-BORDEL CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

Bosc-Bordel is a village and commune 20 miles (32 kilometres) north-east of Rouen, and 7 miles (10 kilometres) west of Forges-les-Eaux, which is a small town on the N.1 5 (Dieppe-Paris) road 34 miles (54 kilometres) south-east of Dieppe. The village of Bosc-Bordel is on the Rouen-Buchy-Forges-les-Eaux bus route. The British grave is just north of the War Memorial in the churchyard.

## **BOSC-LE-HARD COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

Bosc-le-Hard is a village and commune 15 miles north-north-east of Rouen. It is on the D.151 road from Igneauville, which is 5 miles (8 kilometres) from Rouen on the N.28 road from Rouen to Bellencombte and Abbeville. There is a railway station (Amiens-Serqueux-Le Havre line) and buses from Rouen to Bellencombte pass through the village of Bosc-le-Hard. The communal cemetery is on the south-east side of the village, some 400 yards from the church. The British graves are near the northern boundary of the cemetery and some 20 yards north-east of the 1870 war monument.

## **BOUDEVILLE CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

Boudeville is a village and commune 16 miles (26 kilometres) south-west of Dieppe, and 4 miles (6 kilometres) north of Yerville, a small town on the N.315 road from Rouen to the seaside village and commune of Veules-les-Roses. The village of Boudeville is just west of this main road, and there is a bus service from Rouen. In the churchyard, north of the church tower, are the graves of two British soldiers, one of whom is not identified.

### **BOURVILLE TONNEVILLE CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

#### **Location notes:**

Bourville is a village and commune 30 kilometres south-west of Dieppe, 12 kilometres south-east of St. Valery-en-Caux, and 5 kilometres south-west of Fontaine-le-Dun, which is a village on the Veules-les-Roses-Yerville road (N.315). Tonneville is a hamlet about 1 mile east of Bourville. The British grave is near the northern boundary of the churchyard just east of the entrance.

#### **Location notes:**

Cany-Barville is a small town 44 kilometres west-south-west of Dieppe on the main road from Dieppe to Fecamp. The Cemetery is on the west side of the town. It lies some 137 metres from the church on the left of a road leading right from the church on entering the town from the direction of Fecamp.

#### **Historical notes:**

The British graves are between the mortuary and shelter near the entrance to the cemetery, and the eastern boundary of the cemetery.

## **CLAVILLE-MOTTEVILLE CHURCHYARD, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

Claville-Motteville is a village and commune 19 kilometres north of Rouen. It is on the east side of the D.151 road from Isneauville, a village 8 kilometres north-east of Rouen on the N.28 road from Rouen to Abbeville, to Bellencombte, which is 21 miles (34 kilometres) north-east of Rouen. The 3 British graves are near the southern boundary hedge of the churchyard.

## **CRIEL-SUR-MER COMMUNAL CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

From the centre of Dieppe take the Avenue Gambetta and Avenue des Canadiens. Head along the N27 out of Dieppe in the direction of Rouen until the first roundabout where there is a CWGC sign. Go across the roundabout and continue until you reach a second roundabout. Take the first turning right where there is another CWGC sign. Continue until Chemin des Jonquilles, a road on the left. The cemetery is on the right of this road and is clearly visible.

**Historical notes:**

The Dieppe Raid of 18-19 August 1942 was the first large scale daylight assault on a strongly held objective on the Continent since the Allied withdrawal of 1940. The objectives of the raid were the destruction of the Dieppe defences and neighbouring radar and aerodrome installations, the raiding of a German divisional headquarters close by and the capture of prisoners. The largely Canadian military force undertook the main assault on Dieppe itself, with flanking assaults by Commando units and additional Canadian battalions to the east and west of the town intended to neutralise batteries that commanded the direct approach. Support was provided by more than 250 naval vessels and 69 air squadrons. Only the assaulting parties on the extreme flanks came within reasonable reach of their ambitious objectives and casualties were very heavy, with more than 3,600 of the military force of 6,100 killed, wounded, missing or captured. Naval casualties numbered 550. Many of those who died in the raid are buried at Dieppe Canadian War Cemetery, where 948 Commonwealth servicemen of the Second World War are now buried or commemorated, 187 of which are unidentified. There are 7 non Commonwealth and 2 non World War burials here. Other casualties of the raid are at Rouen, where some of the wounded were taken to hospital.

## **JANVAL CEMETERY, DIEPPE, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

Dieppe is a seaport at the mouth of the River Arques. Janval is one of the suburbs of Dieppe and the 'Cimetiere de Janval' is one of the town cemeteries. It is situated to the south-west of the port area. From the town square, the Place du Martyrs, head south on the Avenue Gambetta (direction Rouen), then take the 3rd exit on your right into the Avenue Boucher-de-Perthes. The cemetery entrance is at the end of this road on the Rue Montigny. A CWGC sign is at the entrance of the cemetery.

### **Historical notes:**

Dieppe was used by Commonwealth forces as a minor base from December 1914 onwards, particularly for supplies of small arms ammunition, forage and flour. From January 1915 to May 1919, "A" Section of No.5 Stationary Hospital was stationed in the town. During this period, 219 Commonwealth burials were made in Janval Cemetery, a large civil burial ground. Most of the graves form two plots in Section T, but there are also three burials among the French and Belgian military graves in Section U. Section F of the cemetery also contains a small plot of 29 Second World War burials, mostly dating from the early months of occupation, before the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Force in May 1940.

The cemetery is on the east side of the D.131 road to Pont Audemer, about 400 yards from the church. The war graves plot surrounds the war memorial on the northwest corner of the cemetery, and in this plot are the graves of three airmen, one of whom belonged to the Royal Air Force and two to the Royal Canadian Air Force.

During the First World War, Le Treport was an important hospital centre and by July 1916, the town contained three general hospitals (the 3rd, 16th and 2nd Canadian), No.3 Convalescent Depot and Lady Murray's B.R.C.S. Hospital. The 7th Canadian, 47th and 16th USA General Hospitals arrived later, but all of the hospitals had closed by March 1919. As the original military cemetery at Le Treport filled, it became necessary to use the new site at Mont Huon. There are now 2,128 Commonwealth burials of the First World War in the cemetery and seven from the Second World War. The cemetery also contains more than 200 German war graves. The cemetery was designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield.

#### **Location notes:**

St Sever Cemetery and St. Sever Cemetery Extension are located within a large communal cemetery situated on the eastern edge of the southern Rouen suburbs of Le Grand Quevilly and Le Petit Quevilly. If approaching Rouen from the north, head for the centre of town and cross over the river Seine, following signs for Caen. Follow this route until you get to the 'Rond Point des Bruyeres' roundabout (next to the football stadium), then take the first exit into the Boulevard Stanislas Girardin. The cemetery is 150 metres down this road on the left. If approaching Rouen from the south, follow the N138 (Avenue des Canadiens) towards the centre of town. At the 'Rond Point des Bruyeres' roundabout (next to the football stadium), take the fourth exit into the Boulevard Stanislas Girardin. The cemetery is 150 metres down this road on the left. If arriving on foot, take the metro to St Sever Metro Station, then follow the Avenue de Caen until you get to the Avenue de la Liberation, then take this road and follow this, which will become the Boulevard du 11 Novembre. At the end of this road is the 'Rond Point des Bruyeres' roundabout. Take the first exit from this into the Boulevard Stanislas Girardin. The cemetery is 150 metres down this road on the left.

#### **Historical notes:**

During the First World War, Commonwealth camps and hospitals were stationed on the southern outskirts of Rouen. A base supply depot and the 3rd Echelon of General Headquarters were also established in the city. Almost all of the hospitals at Rouen remained there for practically the whole of the war. They included eight general, five stationary, one British Red Cross and one labour hospital, and No. 2 Convalescent Depot. A number of the dead from these hospitals were buried in other cemeteries, but the great majority were taken to the city cemetery of St. Sever. In September 1916, it was found necessary to begin an



extension, where the last burial took place in April 1920. During the Second World War, Rouen was again a hospital centre and the extension was used once more for the burial of Commonwealth servicemen, many of whom died as prisoners of war during the German occupation. The cemetery extension contains 8,346 Commonwealth burials of the First World War (ten of them unidentified) and in Block "S" there are 328 from the Second World War (18 of them unidentified). There are also 8 Foreign National burials here. The extension was designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield.

## **ST. VALERY-EN-CAUX FRANCO-BRITISH CEMETERY, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Location notes:**

St. Valery-en-Caux is a small seaside town and holiday resort 32 kilometres west of Dieppe and 60 kilometres north-west of Rouen. The Franco-British Cemetery lies on the south eastern outskirts of the town about 200 metres from the church and adjoins the civil cemetery. Follow St. Valery town centre, and the first CWGC sign is on the right of the main road.

### **Historical notes:**

During the Second World War, the town of St. Valery was three-quarters destroyed and was under German occupation from the end of May 1940 until liberated in 1944. In 1940 it was at the centre of important battles when Commonwealth troops, notably the 51st (Highland) Division, made their last stand fighting alongside the 2nd French Cavalry Division. The 51st (Highland) Division was practically wiped out, most of its members being taken prisoner. After the war, the French Government bestowed the Croix de Guerre on the town, and the order conferring the honour contained the words, "St. Valery . . . made illustrious by the heroic resistance of the 51st Scottish Division". Facing each other on the cliffs that flank the town are, to the east the 51st (Highland) Division Memorial, and to the west the memorial to the French Cavalry, which were unveiled simultaneously. In the cemetery is a memorial to the 51st (Highland) Division erected by the local civil authorities, and a granite St. Andrew's shield given, by the Marchioness of Huntley, is set into the base of the Cross of Sacrifice. The cemetery gates were the gift of the people of north and north-east Scotland. The cemetery contains 234 Commonwealth burials of the Second World War, 63 of them unidentified. There are also 218 French war graves.

## **STE. MARIE CEMETERY, LE HAVRE, Seine-Maritime, France**

### **Visiting information:**

### **Location notes:**

Ste. Marie Cemetery is one of the town cemeteries, but it is actually situated in the commune of Graille-St. Honorine, overlooking Le Havre from the north. The main entrance to the cemetery is on the Rue du 329<sup>e</sup> Régiment d'Infanterie. There is another entrance on the west side of the cemetery which is closest to the main war graves plots and this can be accessed via the Rue Eugène Landoas. Please note that the sketch plan of the cemetery that can be downloaded from the Commissions website was drawn up many years ago as a guide to the layout of the plots within it. The road names and numbers shown on the plan are therefore no longer representative of today.

### **Historical notes:**

During the First World War, Le Havre was one of the ports at which the British Expeditionary Force disembarked in August 1914. Except for a short interval during the German advance in 1914, it remained No.1 Base throughout the war and by the end of May 1917, it contained three general and two stationary hospitals, and four convalescent depots. The first Commonwealth burials took place in Division 14 of Ste Marie Cemetery in mid August 1914. Burials in Divisions 19, 3, 62 and 64 followed successively. A memorial in Plot 62 marks the graves of 24 casualties from the hospital ship 'Salta' and her patrol boat, sunk by a mine on 10 April 1917. The memorial also commemorates by name the soldiers, nurses and merchant seamen lost from the 'Salta' whose bodies were not recovered, and those lost in the sinking of the hospital ship 'Galeka' (mined on 28 October 1916) and the transport ship 'Normandy' (torpedoed on 25 January 1918), whose graves are not known. There are now 1,690 Commonwealth burials of the First World War in this cemetery, 8 of which are unidentified. During the Second World War, Le Havre was one of the evacuation ports for the British Expeditionary force in 1940 and towards the end of the war it was used as a supply and reinforcement base. There are now 364 burials of the Second World War here, (59 of them unidentified) in Divisions 64 and 67 of the cemetery. The Commonwealth plots in the cemetery were designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield.

Vittefleur is a village and commune 40 kilometres west of Dieppe, on the D.10 road, which runs north from Cany Barville, a small town 12 kilometres south-west of St. Valery-en-Caux. The two British graves are in the south-west corner of the churchyard.
